

The National Level Mediation Competition 2025-26

COMPETITION FORMAT & RULES:

1. ELIGIBILITY:

This Competition is open to students pursuing their Bachelor's degree in the current academic year i.e. 2025-26 in a three-year course or five years course in Law from any recognized School/College/University in India.

2. NUMBER OF TEAMS:

Maximum one team from each participating college will be allowed.

3. FORMAT OF THE COMPETITION:

- a) The Competition shall comprise of Preliminary Rounds and Final Round.
- b) The Competition shall be conducted in hybrid mode.
- c) The Preliminary Round will be held online on 9th Jan 2026
- d) The top 2 teams, on the basis of cumulative team scores, will qualify to enter finals.
- e) The final round will be held offline at the college venue on 14th Feb 2026.

4. COMPOSITION OF TEAM:

- a) The Team shall comprise of only 3 participants - Client, Counsel and Mediator.
- b) The Participants may change their roles within their Team only after the prior intimation and approval of the Organizing Committee.

5. LANGUAGE:

The official and only language of the Competition shall be English.

6. STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION:

a. Preliminary Round –

The Team will be required to represent only one side as per the given mediation problem, which will be determined by “**Draw of lots**”

b) Final Round (Offline)

- a. The top 2 Teams from the Preliminary Round will proceed to the Final Round on the basis of cumulative team score.
- b. The Team will be required to represent only one side as per the given mediation problem, which will be determined by **“Draw of lots”**

TIME PERIOD - The following shall be the time period for each round.

- a. Preliminary Round: **20 minutes (online)**
- b. Final Round: **30 minutes (offline)**

7.REGISTRATION:

- a. Interested teams are required to register by filling out the registration form provided at the end of the Brochure.
·The last date for registration is **30/11/ 2025**
- b. The Teams are required to ensure that College Registration Form is filled-up prior to filling-up the competition registration form. **(Note: College Registration Form needs to be filled only once)**
- c. The receipt of both college registration and competition registration forms shall only confirm the participation of a team in the competition.
- d. Communication made by the Organizing College with any one of the Team Members shall be deemed to be communication to the entire team for the purpose of this Competition.

8.ACCOMMODATION:

Accommodation shall only be provided to teams qualifying for the Final Offline Rounds.

Accommodation shall be provided from 13th Feb 2026 (Afternoon) to 2026 14th Feb (Morning).

Teams arriving earlier shall contact the hotel/accommodation

- a. venue directly (details of the accommodation will be shared later) and make their bookings accordingly or make arrangements on their own.
- b. Extra charges will have to be incurred by the team for additional days of stay.
- c. Accommodation shall not be provided to other members, coach, faculty or family member.
- d. Any misconduct at the venue or the place of accommodation shall result in disqualification of the team from the competition. Decisions of the organizers in such situation shall be final.
- e. Transport shall be provided to and from the accommodation to the event venue. In case the participants miss the transport arranged by the Organizing College, they have to make arrangements at their own cost.
- f. No pick up or drop shall be provided to and from airport/railway station/bus stand to the accommodation or the event venue.

9. DRESS CODE:

- i. The participants shall follow the below mentioned dress code during the conduct of the competition:
 - a) Females: Western Formals of White shirt and black trousers along with black blazer or Indian formals along with black blazer.
 - b) Males: White shirt, black trousers along with black blazer.
- ii. Non – Adherence to dress code shall be penalized by the judges in the form of deduction of marks.
- iii. The dress code for all the functions at the competition shall be western formals for gentlemen and western or Indian formals for ladies.

10. RESULTS:

- i. Results for the Preliminary Rounds would be declared on the next day of the rounds.
- ii. The Final result and the winners of the various categories will be announced only during the valedictory / prize distribution ceremony.

11. SCORING:

- i. The parameters for judging the oral presentation are:
 - a. Extraction of information.
 - b. Knowledge and application of Law to facts
 - c. Time management
 - d. Ability to answer Judge's questions.
 - e. Impact of Mediator on overall Mediation process.
- ii. Each criterion shall carry 20 marks and the total marks for per Judge per team would be out of 100.
- iii. If there is tie between teams, it shall be resolved by the toss of a coin.

12. AWARDS:

- i. Winner Team - Trophy+ Certificate of Merit
- ii. Second Prize Winner - Trophy + Certificate of Merit
- iii. Best Mediator - Trophy + Certificate of Merit
- iv. All participants will be issued participation certificates.

13. ANONYMITY:

- i. Participants may introduce her/himself in the manner of their code number and may not state her/his names. Also, the team's college / institution affiliation may not be mentioned at any time before the awards ceremony.
- ii. Further, all team members, coaches, advisors, and observers shall refrain from identifying a team's school at any time and in any manner, including, but not limited to, wearing any identifying items, such as school clothing, ties, patches, or pins or carrying identifying material (such as a book with a college logo, or college seal).

14. DECISION OF THE JUDGES SHALL BE FINAL

15. GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION:

- Misconduct, whether behavioral or otherwise.
- Misuse of technology
- Any discussion with client before competition.
- Intimidation in any form

16. OTHER INFORMATION:

1. Participants shall join the meeting/ session well before the scheduled time.
2. Only after being allowed by the moderator a speaker shall unmute his/her mic.
3. No photo, audio or video taping of oral pleadings is permitted.
4. The organizers shall not be responsible for any loss due to slow or non-functional internet connection during the Competition.
5. We request all the participants to arrange a sound internet connection and adequate backup arrangement for connectivity and laptop/PC/Smartphone
6. If there is any situation, not covered by the Rules, the decision of the Organizers shall be final and binding.
7. The participants are always required to comply with the rules formulated by the Organizing Committee during the competition. In case of any non-compliance with the rules of the competition, penalty may be imposed by deduction of marks and the teams may also be disqualified.

National Level Client Counselling Competition 2025-2026

COMPETITION FORMAT & RULES:

Team Composition :- Every Team will Consist of two counsels

1. Each team consisting of two student participants would be allotted a room for interview and counselling. Here the team will conduct themselves as advocates in a lawyer's chamber.
2. The client will be a person trained by the organizers and would consult the team with a problem. The team is required to elicit all relevant information from the client by interviewing or questioning the client and then counsel the client.
3. All teams will be pre-assigned a letter designation (A, B, C... etc) by the organizer by drawing of lots.

4. Competition Rules:

(a) The Consultation (Interview) Period: All teams will go through a Consultation session. The first slot is devoted to consultation with the client during which the team is expected to elicit the relevant information, outline the problem and propose a solution or other means of resolving the problem. All teams will be given the same problem for a given round.

(b) The Discussion Period: All teams will go through a Discussion session. In this session, the team will propose a solution or other means of resolving the problem to the Client.

(c) Post Consultation Period: All teams will go through a Post Consultation session. During the post-consultation, the participants in the team shall talk loudly to each other, loud enough to be heard by the Judges. The post-consultation performance may summarize the interview, indicate the scope of legal work to be undertaken, and state the legal issues that should be researched.

Teams may exhibit their legal knowledge and understanding during the Post Consultation session. The Judges may question the team within this period and may use any technique in this period to assist themselves in their judging.

(d) During the consultation and the post-consultation, the team may use books, notes, files and other materials.

(e) The Judges may penalize the students who allow the interview sessions to run beyond the time allotted in the rules. However, the Judges in their discretion, taking into account the circumstances, may allow some time beyond the stipulated period for the interview.

(f) The organizers will arrange their own timekeepers, who will ring a warning bell at the start of each period, one bell during the period calling out time left and final bell at the end of allotted time period.

(g) In order to preserve anonymity each team will be identified to the Judges only by a number or letter, which will be allotted to each team by the organizers.

(h) Any interaction among the competing teams once the rounds have started will be considered as misconduct and the teams may be disqualified.

(i) All teams will be given the same problem.

(j) Each Judge will evaluate for a maximum of 100 marks independently. The decision of the Judges and Organising College in the matter shall be final and binding.

(k) The organizers reserve the right to amend or modify the rules and regulations.

ROUNDS

There shall be Two rounds in this competition.

(i) Preliminary Round (Online) According to the cumulative scores of the preliminary rounds, the top 2 teams will move to the Final rounds.

(ii) Final Round (Offline) - Top 2 teams which qualify from the preliminary round shall compete in Final rounds out of which the First Prize and Second Prize Winner shall be declared based on Scores.

DURATION OF ROUNDS

(i) Total time for Preliminary Rounds: 20 minutes (The break-up is as follows)

(a) Interview / Consultation Session of 10 Minutes

(b) Discussion Session of 5 Minutes

(c) Post-Consultation Session of 5 Minutes

(ii) Total time for Final Round: 30 minutes (The break-up is as follows)

(a) Consultation/ Interview Session of 20 Minutes

(b) Discussion Session of 05 Minutes

(c) Post-Consultation Session of 05 Minutes.

DRESS CODE:

- i. The participants shall follow the below mentioned dress code during the conduct of the competition:
 - a) Females: Western Formals of White shirt and black trousers along with black blazer or Indian formals alongwith black blazer.
 - b) Males: White shirt, black trousers alongwith black blazer.
 - ii. Non – Adherence to dress code shall be penalized by the judges in the form of deduction of marks.
- iii. The dress code for all the functions at the competition shall be western formals for gentlemen and western or Indian formals for ladies.

JUDGING STANDARDS

1. Establishing the working atmosphere: Whether the participants established the beginning of an effective professional relationship and working atmosphere and at an appropriate point oriented the client to the special nature of the relationship in a courteous, sensitive and professional manner.
 2. Description of the problem: Whether the participants learned how the client viewed his or her situation, using a combination of listening and questioning ability, drawing out both information and feelings, as appropriate, to develop a reasonably complete and reliable description of the problem and reflecting this understanding to the client.
 3. Client's goals, expectations and needs: Whether the participants learned the client's goals and initial expectations and modified or developed them as necessary, giving attention in doing so to all aspects of the problem.
 4. Problem Analysis: Whether the participants analyzed the client's problem with creativity and both legal and non-legal perspectives, resulting in a clear and useful formulation of the problem by asking specific relevant questions.
- Legal analysis and Legal advice: Legal analysis and the consequent legal advice given should be both accurate and appropriate to the

5. situation and its context. Consistence with analysis of the clients' problem develops a set of potential and feasible alternatives, if any, both legal and non-legal.

6. Client's informed choice: Whether the participants having developed a set of potentially effective and feasible alternatives assist the client in making an informed choice. Potential legal, economic, social and psychological consequences should be taken into account.

7. Effective conclusion: Whether the participants concluded the interview skillfully and left the client with feeling of reasonable confidence and understanding, with appropriate reassurance, and with a clear sense of specific explanation and mutual obligations to follow.

8. Teamwork: Whether the participants as collaborating counselors, worked together as a team, with flexibility and an appropriate balance of participation.

9. Professional and ethical relationship throughout the interview: Whether the participants developed an appropriate balance in dealing with the legal and emotional needs of the client.

10 De-briefing (Post Interview Reflection): Whether the participants, during the post consultation time, gave evidence of having recognized their own and the client's feelings; the strengths and limitations of their interviewing skills, their handling of substantive aspects of the client's problems (both legal and non-legal), the quality and the appropriateness, of their advice and provided for an effective follow-up

National Level Letter to Chief Justice India Competition 2025-26

COMPETITION FORMAT & RULES:

1. ELIGIBILITY:

This Competition is open to students pursuing their Bachelor's degree in the current academic year i.e. 2025-26 in a three-year course or five years course in Law from any recognized School/College/University in India.

2. NUMBER OF TEAMS:

A maximum of ONE team comprising of two participants. Even one participant may be allowed to participate in the competition from one institute.

3. FORMAT OF THE COMPETITION:

- a) The Competition shall comprise of only One Round
- b) The Competition shall be conducted in offline mode at College Venue.
- c) The competition will be held offline at the college venue on 14th February 2026
- d) All Teams will participate in the Competition together and will have same problem.
- e) The Teams will have prescribed time of 1.5 hours (90 Minutes) to complete the letter, though Teams can complete and submit the letter earlier than stipulated time, but not before at least 1 hour from the commencement.

4. COMPOSITION OF TEAM:

- a) Each team will comprise of minimum 1 or maximum of 2 participants.

5. LANGUAGE:

The official and only language of the Competition shall be English.

6. STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION:

- i. The topic for the letter will be disclosed only at the start of the competition, at the venue.

A blank Inland Letter will be provided to the participants at the time of the competition. Only One Letter is expected to be submitted by each Team.

- ii. The letter should be hand-written in English.
- iii. Participating teams should enter only their team code in the space provided for the address on Inland Letter provided to them.
- iv. The time allotted to write the letter will be 1.5 hours.
- v. The Team Members can discuss / consult each other during the allotted time.

1. GUIDELINES FOR WRITING THE LETTER:

- i. Avoid excessive use of legal terms. Participants should keep in mind that this is a method of appeal used by the common man.
 - ii. Clean and legible handwriting is welcome.
- iii. The letter should be formulated so as to emphasize the larger public interest of the given topic.
 - iv. The parameters for judging the letter are:
 - a. Understanding of Issue at hand along with general knowledge on the topic.
 - b. Ability to express the facts, concerns and issues in an appealing manner.
 - c. Tidiness, grammar, syntax, tone of letter.
 - d. Impact created by letter on the overall subject.

7. RESULTS:

- i. Results of the Letter to Chief Justice will be declared after completion of the Competition.
- ii. Decision of Judges shall be considered Final and shall be binding on all Teams.
- iii. The First Prize and Second Prize Winning Teams would require to attend the Valedictory Ceremony to receive their Trophies and Certificates.

8. REGISTRATION:

- Interested teams are required to register by filling out the registration form provided at the end of the Brochure.
 - The last date for registration is 30/11/2025
