

**BRIEF TRANSLATION OF THE CIRCULAR OF UNIVERSITY OF MUMBAI
DATED 22-05-2020 REGARDING EXAM AND RESULT OF ALL CLASSES
OTHER THAN THE FINAL YEAR OF 3 YEARS AND 5 YEARS COURSES**

In furtherance to the circular dated 18th May 2020, the details regarding declaration of result of all classes except the final year classes of the 3 years and 5 years courses are as follows.

1. In case the Internal exams and/or Practical exams of regular students have not been conducted, then such Internal exams and/or Practical exams must be conducted in any convenient mode or manner e.g. Online test, Project or Assignment submission, Telephonic oral-test or Presentations, etc.
2. To calculate the average of the previous semester, marks of all subjects, whether failed or passed (marks of Theory, Practical, Oral, Term work) should be added and converted/ scaled to 50 marks. If papers of the odd semesters have been revaluated, then the revaluated marks shall be considered for calculating the average.
3. In case of classes who do not have Internal exams, (i.e. Semesters 3 & 4 of Three years and Semesters 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, & 8 of Five years); marks of the subjects of the previous/odd semesters shall be granted to this semester i.e. the current/even semester. (Out of 100)
4. For the students of Second Year of Three years Gen. LL. B. course; and students of Second, Third and Fourth Year of Five years B.L.S./ LL. B. course, average marks of odd semesters shall be granted to the even semesters.
5. In case of classes who have Internal exams, (i.e. Semester 1 & 2 of First year of the 3 years course and Semester 1 & 2 First year of the 5 years course who have 60/40 pattern); their marks shall be calculated as stated below.

Table 1: Marks received by a student in Semester 1 (previous semester) of 5 years course in February 2020 exam

In the above table, the student has scored 208/300, which is 69%. Now for calculating marks for current semester, i.e. semester 2, half of 69% i.e. **35%** (rounded off) shall be considered as valid.

Table 2: Marks for the student for Semester 2 of 5 years course in April 2020 exam shall be calculated as shown in the table below.

In Table 2, the Internal Marks, are 40 marks. While calculating the External component, the Internal marks i.e. 40 marks have been downscaled to 10. The marks so calculated (which is one-fourth of the Internal Marks of current semester), are added to 35 (which is the 50% component calculated from Table 1). We thus arrive at the total of External Marks. These External marks are then added to the Internal marks received in this current semester, to arrive at the total marks out of 100.

Table 1: Marks received by a student in Semester 1 (previous semester) of 3 years course in February 2020 exam

In the above table, the student has scored 289/400, which is 72%. Now for calculating marks for current semester, i.e. semester 2, half of 72% i.e. **36%** shall be considered as valid.

Table 2: Marks for the student for Semester 2 of 3 years course in April 2020 exam shall be calculated as shown in the table below.

6. The grading shall remain the same as per the CBCS Manual.
7. In case of students who fail after being graded as per the above gradation system, then they shall appear for the ATKT exam which shall be conducted within 120 days from the commencement of the next academic year i.e. A. Y. 1920-21.

8. In case of students who do not have Internal exams (Refer to point no. 3): If a student has failed in any subject of the previous semester (odd semester), then he/she shall have to appear for the ATKT exam of that subject which shall be conducted within 120 days from the commencement of the next academic year. Hence, the result of the current semester (even semester) of such students shall be prepared only after the result of the ATKT exam is declared. If a student has failed in any subjects of both even and odd semesters, then such student shall appear for those exams in the next semester i.e. November 2020.
9. In case a student from the 60/40 pattern has failed in previous semester (odd semester) and passes in the current semester (even semester), then he/she shall appear for ATKT exam of only the previous semester (odd semester). The result of his/her current semester (even semester) shall not change later.
10. After applying the above system of gradation, if any student is not satisfied with his/her marks, he/she shall have an option to appear for grade improvement exam which shall be conducted within 120 days from the commencement of the next academic year.
11. Students who fail in the current semester (even semester) after applying the system of gradation, OR students who fail in the ATKT exam previous semester (odd semester) which shall be conducted within 120 days from the commencement of the next academic year; such students shall have to appear for the ATKT exam that will be conducted in the November 2020.
12. (Not Applicable to Law) Point Nos. 12 and 13 are not relevant to the faculty of law. They state that in case of colleges who have conducted examinations of semester 2 & 4 and semesters 1& 3, should assess the answer sheets. Moderation of these answer sheets is not necessary in view of the current pandemic situation. The students should be marked based on current marks and 50% marks of internals plus 50% marks of previous semester; whichever are higher.

13. The execution of above-stated grading system shall be applicable only to the graduation and post-graduation students who have duly filled examination forms and applied for the examination.

The colleges who declare the result as per the rules of the University of Mumbai, may declare the results after following the above system of marking and gradation; after the date of declaration of result is directed by the University of Mumbai.
