It was accepted by Advocate Anjali Helekar, Vice President of the People's Education Society, and Professor Dr. Vaishali Gurav, acting Principal of the college. The event was attended by PricewaterhouseCoopers Partner Vivek Shukla and Design, Creativity and Media Director Suchendra Kumar. Founded in 1999, Education World describes its mission as 'building public opinion to place education at the top of the national agenda'. Since 2019, it has introduced Grand Jury Rankings to recognise higher education institutions across India.



The College takes pride in announcing that Mrs. Vaishali Manoj Gurav, Research Scholar, has been awarded the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Law by CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bengaluru. Her doctoral thesis, titled "A Critical Analysis of the Role of Protection Officers in the Implementation of the Domestic Violence Act, 2005, with Special Reference to Women Protection Officers in Mumbai City," was successfully defended on 27 November 2025 under the guidance of Dr. Sanjay Bang, Associate Professor, School of Law, CHRIST, (Deemed to be University). Her research makes a significant contribution to the understanding of legal protections available to women under the Domestic Violence Act, 2005, and highlights the pivotal role of Protection Officers in ensuring effective enforcement and implementation of the law. The College congratulates Dr. Vaishali Gurav on this remarkable academic achievement.



Aanya Singh (S.Y.B.A./LL.B.) was selected among 26 academicians globally to present at the University of Cambridge for the edited volume *Pluriloguing with Ourselves*, focusing on non-Euro-dominant feminist movements worldwide. She has also authored a research paper on plain language in law, selected for a forthcoming special issue of a journal affiliated with Cornell University and currently undergoing final peer-review revisions.

PLACEMENT CELL

Our college has established a Placement Cell. The society has established the PES Law College renamed as Adv. Balasaheb Apte College of Law offering the Five Years Law Course from the academic year 2012 - 13 and the Three Years Course from the academic year 2017 - 18. From the academic year 2024-25, the college has also commenced the Master of Laws (LL.M.) program. The College is located at the prime location of Dadar (West) which is

near Dadar Station. It also has the advantage of having BEST buses going in all the directions of Mumbai. The Adv. Balasaheb Apte College of Law has an exclusive building with an area of about 49,000 sq. feet, with 14 classrooms, a modern Library, Computer Laboratory, Seminar Rooms, Moot-Court Room, Gymkhana, Gymnasium, Canteen and Audio-Visual Room & Auditorium. PES Trust employs around 90 Teachers and Non-Teaching Staff.

ABOUT ADV. BALASAHEB APTE



People's Education Society's Adv. Balasaheb Apte College of Law is named after the esteemed Senior Advocate Balavant Parashuram Apte (widely known as Adv. Balasaheb Apte) who played an important role in establishing this college. He desired that apart from creating and developing

skills for litigation and creating competent lawyers and judges, a college should be able to imbibe a sense of social responsibility toward nation-building amongst the students.

Shri. Balasaheb Apte was born on 18th January, 1939 at Rajgurunagar in Pune District. He completed his school and part of college education in Rajgurunagar and Pune. He also did his M.A. and LL.M. from the University of Mumbai. He taught in the LL.B. and LL.M. courses at New Law College, Mumbai and University of Mumbai. Besides his academic excellence, he was also an excellent and inspirational orator.

His vast study and understanding of our nation's ancient knowledge and his grasp of current developments in various fields reflected in his presentation of thoughts. Shri Balasaheb Apte, an advocate of eminence, was the President of Advocates Association of Western India, Bombay High Court. He was also the Additional Advocate General, State of Maharashtra from the period 1996 to 1998 and also appeared in many significant matters. He was not only an Advocate but he was a human being having qualities of head and heart. He kept honesty and modesty in the legal profession. He was warm, friendly and gentle as a person.

Shri Balasaheb Apte's learning and skills did not remain confined to law and advocacy. Reading and writing were his hobbies. He had a deep knowledge and liking for literature and command over languages – Marathi, Hindi and English. He was also well versed in Sanskrit language and literature. As a result, he authored many celebrated books. He was on the Governing Council of Shikshan Prasarak Mandali, an educational institution running 20 colleges and schools for about two decades. He was National President of Akhil Bhartiya Vidyarthi Parishad and was active in Parishad for 38 years. He was instrumental in articulating its ideological views as well as organizational practices on the sound foundations of nationalist pursuits. He was a guardian to thousands of Parishad workers, students and teachers who regarded him as a friend, philosopher and guide. He worked passionately for bringing about change in the education system as well as the student-mindset. Apart from this, he was also a member of the Senate of University of Mumbai as well as a Member of Parliament in the Rajya Sabha from 2000 to 2012.

It is a matter of great pride that University of Mumbai has established a "Prof. Balasaheb Apte Centre for Studies in Students and Youth Movement" to encourage research and social awareness amongst students.

Shri Balasaheb Apte left for his heavenly abode on 17th July, 2012 at the age of 73 years. It is the constant effort of the Management of the People's Education Society and staff of Adv. Balasaheb Apte College of Law to fulfill his vision and achieve excellence.

COURSES OFFERED

We, at Adv. Balasaheb Apte College of Law offer 5 and 3-year degree courses in Law and 2 – year LL.M. program as well. Admissions to 5-year degree course in law can be taken after passing H.S.C. Board examinations from any discipline and obtaining the required score at the MH-CET (Law). Admissions to a 3-year degree course in law can be taken after passing Degree examinations from any discipline (prescribed in the pattern of 10+2+3) and obtaining the required score at the MH-CET (Law). Admissions to an LL. M. degree course in law can be taken after passing any Law Degree examinations and obtaining the required score at the CET (Law).

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The College follows eligibility criteria as specified by the Director of Higher Education, Government of Maharashtra. Students are requested to refer to the website of the Government of Maharashtra <http://www.mahacet.org> or the college website www.abalawcollege.com or the college notice board from time to time for details and updates in the matter. Students who have passed H.S.C. or equivalent or Degree examinations (prescribed in the pattern of 10+2+3) from any stream, with 45% or above marks and have obtained the required score in the MH-CET (Law) are eligible. However, the above percentage of marks shall be relaxed by for candidates belonging to the Reserved Category as per the relevant notifications of the State Government. IB students have to submit the predicted grade and certificate of conversion of grades into percentage if their result is not declared at the time of submitting the admission form.

Prohibition to register for two regular courses of study

No student shall be allowed to simultaneously register for a law degree programme with any other graduate or post-graduate or certificate course run by the same or any other university or an institute for academic or professional learning except the integrated degree programme of the same institution.

Provided that any short period part time certificate course on language, computer science or computer application of an institute or any course run by a Centre for Distance Learning of a University however, shall be accepted. (Rule 6, Rules of Legal Education 2008, Bar Council of India.)

Admission Form and Documents Required

Application forms for 5-year B.A./LL.B., 3-year Gen./ LL.B. and 2 years LL.M. programs and the Prospectus are available on the college website. Forms duly filled in must be submitted to the College office. Admissions are based on merit, as prescribed by the Maharashtra State CET.

Students are required to confirm the admission in person by submitting the following certificates with the application form:

- 1) Original Allotment Letter issued by the State CET Cell.
- 2) Original CET Score card and CET Hall ticket. (optional)
- 3) Std. X Mark sheet & Passing Certificate (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 4) School Leaving Certificate (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 5) Std. XI Mark sheet (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 6) Std. XII Mark sheet & Passing Certificate (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 7) Std. XII Leaving Certificate (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 8) Degree mark sheets (All Semesters), Degree Passing Certificate, Degree Certificate for 3 Year Course (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 9) Degree Transfer Certificate.



- 10) LL. B. Degree mark sheets (All Semesters), Degree Passing Certificate, Degree Certificate for 2 Year LL.M. program (Original, One attested photocopy & Two Non- Attested photocopies.)
- 11) If the student is from other than Maharashtra State Board, he/she should submit the following additional documents:
 - (a) Original Migration Certificate from the Board/University which he/she passes the examination and an attested photocopy thereof.
 - (b) A copy of the Provisional Eligibility Certificate and Enrollment Registration Form from the University of Mumbai, duly signed.
 - (c) A Provisional Eligibility fee of Rs. 320/- to be paid in cash at the time of admission.
- 12) Caste Certificate, Caste Validity Certificate, Non-Creamy Layer Certificate if applicable. (Original, one attested photocopy & Two Non-Attested photocopies.)
- 13) Domicile Certificate/ Birth Certificate/ School Leaving Certificate mentioning Place of Birth.
- 14) Two (2) recent passport size photographs. (One photograph to be affixed on the Admission Form)
- 15) In case of a student from a college affiliated to the University of Mumbai, No Objection Certificate (NOC) from that college.
- 16) Foreign students seeking admission should produce their passport & student's visa at the time of admission. Students on tourist visas will not be admitted to the college.
- 17) Married female students should produce attested true photocopy of marriage certificate or in case of change of name, they should produce an affidavit and an attested true photocopy of gazette publication.
- 18) Undertaking to attend a minimum of 75% of the total number of lectures held during each semester as per University Regulations.
- 19) Undertaking as mandated by the Bar Council of India.
- 20) Undertaking to follow the "Social Media Policy" of the college.
- 21) Undertaking for availing Scholarship
- 22) The Principal should be informed in writing about any change in the information submitted by the student in the admission form.
- 23) If subsequently it is found out that any statement of the applicant is incorrect or false, his/her admission is liable to be cancelled without refund of fees.
- 24) Students from Universities other than the University of Mumbai will be admitted provided that the examinations of the other Universities are considered equivalent and are subject to the provisions of eligibility conditions of the University of Mumbai.

Important Note: Original documents, along with the prescribed fees to be submitted as per the provisional admission schedule put up on the college notice board from time to time. Students shall be informed to submit additional documents to the college as and when required by the Department of Higher Education.

FEES

The fee for the First Year of five years' course is Rs. 41,500/- and for the three years' course is Rs. 40,000/-. Fees for the LL.M. course is Rs. 48,000/- per year. The fees shall be subject to change, depending on the directives from the University of Mumbai and subject to the approval of the concerned authorities. Full fees must be paid along with the required deposit amounts at the time of admission. No student will be permitted ordinarily, to appear for any of the University/College Examinations if he/ she has not paid the College/Examination fees for the year. Fees and other dues shall be payable as prescribed from time to time by the competent authorities.

Refund of Fees:

Fee Deduction on Cancellation of Admission shall be as per the prevailing rules of the State CET Cell. Students are advised to preserve their fee receipt carefully. Refunds of deposits/admission cancellation fees will be made only by cheque on submission of the original fee receipt. A duplicate fee receipt may be issued on payment of Rs. 50/- with the special permission of the Principal. Caution Money and Library Deposit amount will be refunded to the students from 1st August to 30th September on completion of the 5 year and 3 year course.

Attendance:

Students must attend lectures, practicals, tutorials, etc. as per the Time-Table. 75% attendance is mandatory for all students. They must not abstain from classes, practicals, tutorials, examinations etc. without the written permission of the Principal. Students whose attendance, progress in various tests and examinations are not satisfactory and who do not attend the required number of tutorials and / or practicals are likely to lose their terms. Students who do not submit compulsory project work in any subject are likely to lose their term. Prolonged absence even on grounds of ill health may also lead to loss of terms. Defaulters will not be allowed to appear for the University Examinations.

Examination:

Standard for passing the Examination shall be as per the ordinance passed from the University of Mumbai. If a candidate is allowed to join the next higher class as provided in the Ordinances relating to the different examinations, he will not be permitted to appear for the higher examinations unless (i) he has previously passed in the remaining subjects of the lower examination, or (ii) he appears in those subjects simultaneously with his appearance at the higher examinations. In the latter case, however, he will, in no circumstances be considered to have passed in the higher examination, or any part of it, unless he passes in the aforesaid subjects (with the percentage, if any, required for the total) at the same time or within two years of his obtaining the marks necessary to pass in the higher examination or any part of it in which separate passing or exemption is permitted by the Regulation.

When a candidate owing to his failure to pass in the remaining subjects of the lower examination within two years is not considered to have passed the higher examination or any part of it, he will forfeit all benefits occurring from the marks obtained by him in the higher examination, but the terms kept by him for such higher examination will be available to him for any further appearance at the examination.

No candidate will be admitted to, and allowed to appear at, the year-end semester examinations unless he/she has successfully passed the Examination in the Practical Training papers for the respective semester to be conducted by the respective colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai, on behalf of the University.

Term Grant and Examination:

To keep a term at a college or recognized institution, an undergraduate must complete to the satisfaction of the Principal or the Head of the institution, the course of study at the college or institution prescribed for such terms for the class to which such undergraduate then belongs.

Although illness or other serious circumstances may be considered valid for the absence at lectures, tests, tutorials; the circumstances cannot condone a student for poor performance or absence and exempt them from appearing for examinations. Accordingly, students with poor records of academic performance will not be granted terms.

Students who have not been granted a term will not be permitted to appear at the First Term/ Second Term/ Annual Examination conducted by the College or by the University.

Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), internal assessments and term end examinations shall be conducted for every subject. The college shall conduct the internal assessments and the University shall conduct the term end examinations. Additional practical/ internal examinations shall be conducted as per the rules of the University of Mumbai.

Library:

The College library will remain open from 8.00 am to 04.00 pm on all working days from Monday to Saturday.

- 1) Text-book section stocks recent editions of Textbooks, Bare Acts, and University Examinations Question Papers etc.
- 2) Students can borrow textbooks for home reading from lending section.

The rules & regulations of the library will be provided to the students separately.

Fines – Late fees of Rs. 5/- per day from the due date of submission. In case of damage or loss of books, the current cost of the book shall be reimbursed.

Identity Card:

Every student must wear the Identity Card as long as he/she is on the College Campus. It must be produced by the student whenever demanded by a member of the teaching or non-teaching staff of the College. She/he must take proper care to avoid its misuse by other students and outsiders. In case the Identity Card is lost, the matter should be immediately



reported to the Principal and an application should be made for a duplicate Identity Card which will be issued on payment of charges.

In case of a loss of Identity Card or to acquire a Duplicate ID Card a fees of Rs. 50/- shall be paid. In case of Loss of marksheet/ Duplicate Marksheet a fee of Rs. 50/- shall be paid.

Discipline:

1. No Society or Association shall be formed in the College and no person should be invited in the College campus without the specific permission of the Principal. The Principal has a right to refuse such permission.
2. All meetings, cultural programmes, debates, elocutions, moot-court etc. organised on the College Premises must be held in presence of teaching staff members and with the prior permission of the Principal. The subjects of debates/elocutions/ moot-courts must have the prior approval of the Principal.
3. Students involved in malpractices at the College/University Examinations will not be admitted to the College.
4. Students shall not do anything inside or outside the College that will interfere with the discipline of the College or tarnish the image of the College or of the other students.
5. Smoking is strictly prohibited on the College Premises.
6. If, for any reason, the continuance of the student in the College is found detrimental to the best interest of the College, the Principal may either ask the student to leave the College without assigning any reasons or refuse to admit the student for the next academic year; and such decision will be final and binding on the student.
7. Acts of misbehavior, misconduct, indiscipline or violation of the rules of discipline mentioned above are liable for one or more punishments as stated below:
 - a. Warning to the student.
 - b. Warning to the student as well as a letter to the parents.
 - c. Imposition of a fine.
 - d. Denial of gymkhana, library, N.S.S., student-aid or any other facility for a specified period or for the whole Term/Year.
 - e. Cancellation of Terms.
 - f. Refusal of admission in the next term or academic year.
 - g. Cancellation of Admission.
 - h. Expulsion from the College for a specified period.
 - i. Rustication.

Ragging:

Ragging is strictly condemned and prohibited in this college. The aggrieved students are requested to report the same to the Anti-Ragging Committee to take speedy action. The guilty shall be dealt with harshly and severe action shall be taken against them as demanded by the situation as per the provisions of 'Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999' and the directions issued by the Courts. To report instances of ragging, students can lodge complaints at - takrar.abacl@gmail.com. An undertaking of anti-ragging has to be submitted by students at the time of admission.

The entire college came together to host the competition, which this year revolved around the issue of "Proceeds of Crime" under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002 (PMLA). The event was conducted on a grand scale and was made successful through the collective efforts of students, faculty members, and alumni.



The event officially commenced with the Orientation Ceremony on 19th September, 2025 at Siddhivinayak Hall, where participants were briefed about the rules and structure of the competition. The ceremony was attended by I/C Principal Dr. Vaishali Gurav, teaching and non-teaching staff, participants, and volunteers. There were a total of two preliminary rounds. In the first preliminary round, the teams presented their arguments before a distinguished panel of judges, including Advocates Ayush Pasbola, Sudhanva

Bedekar, Arjun Kadam and Uttam Dubey. After lunch, the second preliminary round began with a new set of esteemed judges: Advocates Bhomesh Bellam, Parth Sangharajka, Akshay Pai and Siddhi Bhosale. In both rounds, participants engaged in mock trials, where they examined witnesses and presented their arguments before the judges. At the end of each preliminary round, the judges were felicitated by the I/C Principal Dr. Vaishali Gurav. Finally, after all rounds concluded, the much-awaited results were declared. The top four teams from the preliminary rounds advanced to the semi-final stage, ready to compete for the next phase of the competition. 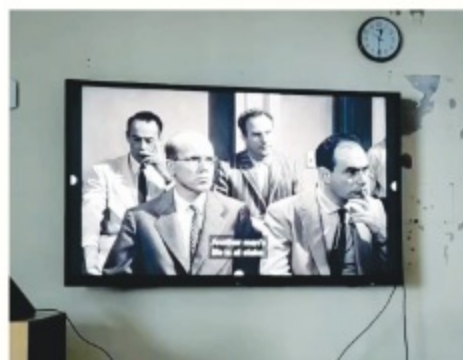

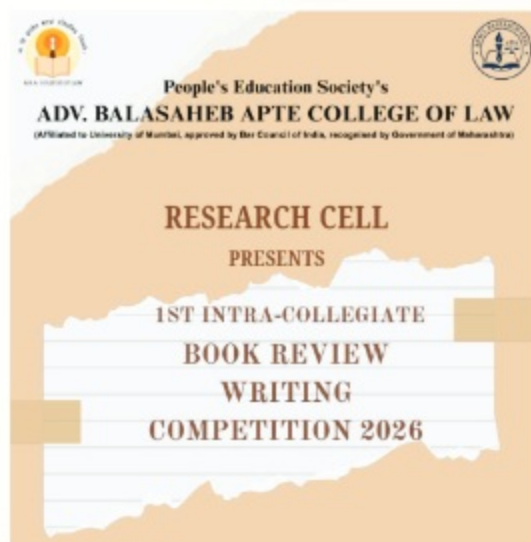
LEGAL AID CAMP

ORIENTATION

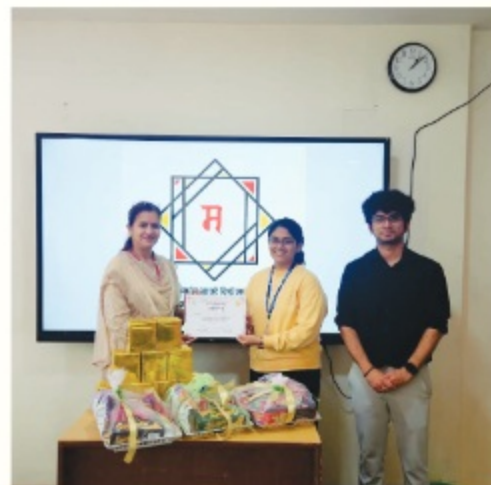

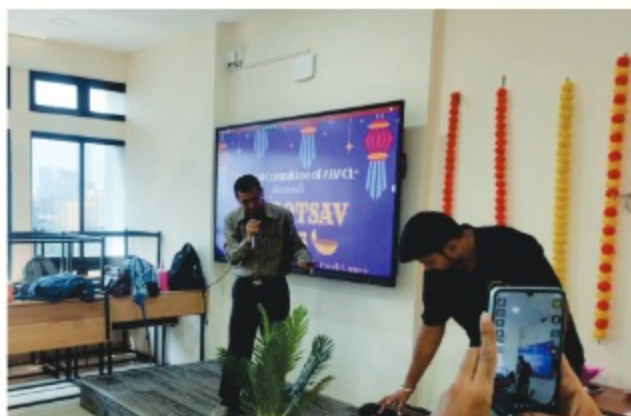


DEEPOTSAV

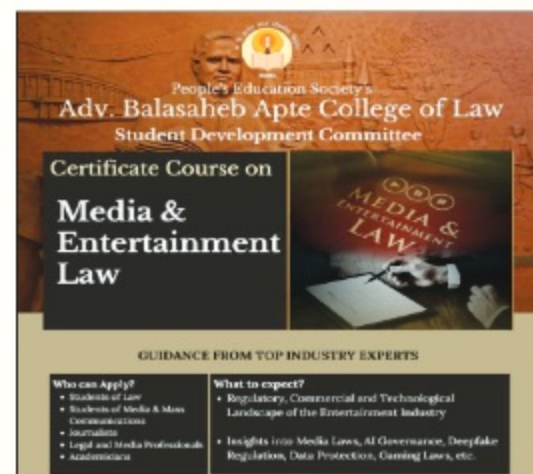


CERTIFICATE COURSE ON MEDIA AND ENTERTAINMENT LAW

TRADITIONAL DAY – BAND BAJA BAARAAT

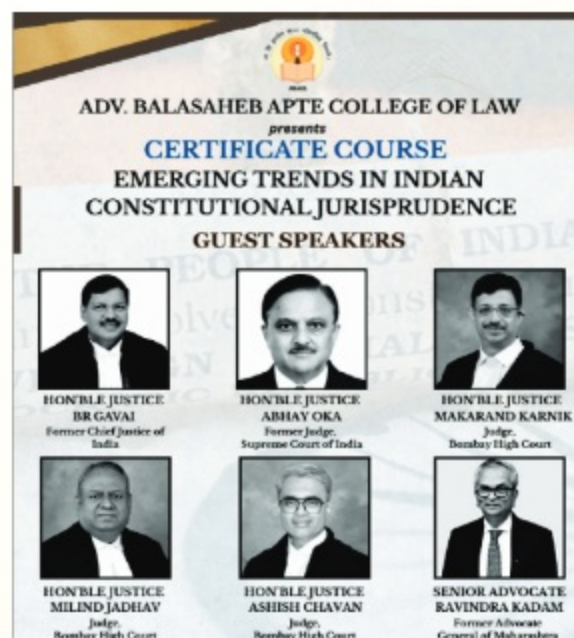

PLACEMENT DAY

Following the success of our first placement drive, Adv. Balasaheb Apte College of Law takes immense pleasure in organizing its second placement day on 31st January 2026. A remarkable total of 26 recruiters were invited to participate in the event. These recruiters represented a diverse range of practice areas and conducted interviews for students from the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Year B.A./LL.B. batches, as well as the S.Y. and T.Y. Gen./LL.B. batches. This year, the Placement Cell extended invitations to the third-year batches with the objective of not only securing internships and pre-placement offers but also providing students with early exposure to the legal profession.

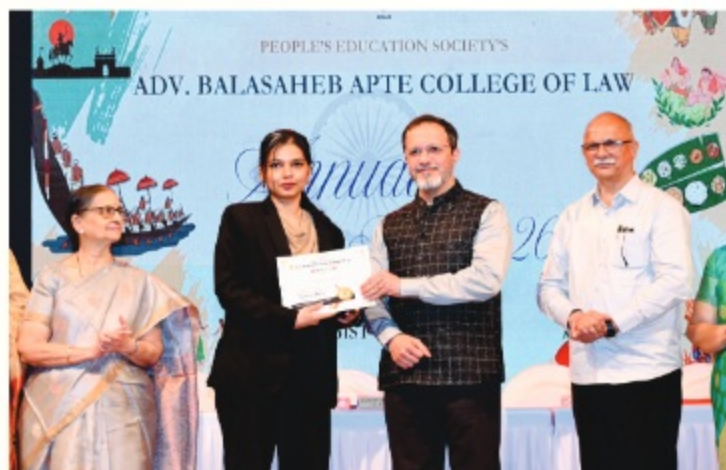

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME(NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of our college demonstrated unwavering dedication to community service, social awareness, and nation-building throughout the academic year. Guided by the timeless motto "Not Me, But You," the unit inspired students to embrace volunteerism, empathy, and a profound sense of social responsibility. Through a wide array of thoughtfully planned activities and programs, the NSS volunteers engaged directly with society, gaining insights into grassroots challenges while making meaningful contributions to the community.

The academic year commenced with the formal installation of the NSS committee, a pivotal event that set the tone for all subsequent initiatives. This committee played a crucial coordinating role, mobilizing student participation and ensuring every program aligned with the National Service Scheme's broader objectives of personal development and societal betterment. Right from the outset, the unit launched targeted campaigns addressing critical social issues, fostering awareness not just among students but also within the wider community.

Social Awareness and Legal Literacy Initiatives

A major focus was combating human trafficking through an impactful Anti-Human Trafficking Workshop. Resource persons and legal experts illuminated the causes, consequences, and legal safeguards against this heinous crime, while volunteers championed the "STOP" message emphasizing vigilance, reporting mechanisms, and collective action.



Complementing this, the unit prioritized legal education by conducting interactive sessions at local schools, such as Dnyandeep Vidyamandir. Here, volunteers demystified fundamental rights, citizen duties, and core legal principles in age-appropriate, engaging ways, sparking vital discussions on justice, equality, and responsible citizenship among young learners.

Patriotic and Constitutional Engagement

Patriotism and constitutional values formed the bedrock of several events. Volunteers united in the Vande Mataram Mass Singing Event, evoking national pride and solidarity. Constitution Day

featured a solemn Preamble Recitation Programme, where participants reflected deeply on the ideals of justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity enshrined in India's founding document. Additional school rallies and workshops reinforced these principles, urging the youth to cherish democratic ethos. National Youth Day, honoring Swami Vivekananda's legacy, included a special screening of a biographical film, prompting reflections on leadership, self-reliance, and selfless service, values that resonated strongly with the volunteers' ethos.

Environmental Sustainability and Welfare Drives

Environmental stewardship was advanced through hands-on projects like seed ball making for afforestation, aimed at restoring ecological balance by dispersing native seeds across barren lands. A spirited beach clean-up drive highlighted marine conservation, with volunteers removing tons of debris while educating locals on coastal ecosystem protection. To combat plastic pollution, the unit promoted eco-friendly alternatives via a paper bag making and distribution drive, supplying vendors and residents with sustainable options alongside awareness on plastic's perils. Social welfare efforts shone in an old clothes collection campaign, channeling donations from the college to underprivileged families, alongside menstrual hygiene workshops with sanitary pad distribution to dismantle taboos and promote health education. Voter awareness rallies and hands-on BMC election volunteering further exemplified civic duty, culminating in proud participation at Republic Day celebrations.

Residential Camp: Immersive Rural Outreach

The year's crowning achievement was the Residential NSS Camp at Shiroshi Village, involving 40 committed volunteers. Preceded by a comprehensive village survey to assess local needs—from sanitation to education—the camp unfolded with immersive activities: community dialogues, targeted awareness sessions, rigorous cleanliness drives, and innovative



social projects tailored to villagers' realities. Living amid rural simplicity, volunteers confronted grassroots issues head-on, forging empathy and practical problem-solving skills that transcended classroom theory.

In essence, the NSS Unit's vibrant tapestry of initiatives—spanning awareness, patriotism, sustainability, and direct service—embodied the “Not Me, But You” philosophy. By nurturing compassionate, proactive citizens, the unit not only enriched the community but also empowered students to drive lasting societal progress.





ROTARACT CLUB OF ADV. BALASAHEB APTE COLLEGE OF LAW (RCBACL)

The Rotaract Club of Balasaheb Apte College of Law (RCBACL), operating under Rotaract International District 3141, stands as a distinguished student organisation and is regarded as one of the few Rotaract Clubs functioning within a law college in the Mumbai District. Chartered on 13th September 2013, the Club has successfully completed thirteen years of dedicated service, consistently upholding the values of service, fellowship, leadership, and professional development that define the global Rotaract movement.



The establishment of the Club was made possible through the foresight of I/C Principal Dr. Vaishali Gurav, a former Rotarian, who envisioned a platform through which law students could engage in social service and leadership beyond academic learning. Under the continued guidance of faculty mentors Prof. Yasha Rao and Prof. Neha Bhatt Mhatre, the Club operates through seven functional avenues: Club Service, Community Service, Professional Development, Sports, Editorial, Public Relations & Marketing, and International Service. Through these avenues, the Club has undertaken a diverse range of initiatives during the academic year 2025–2026.

The academic year began with Anonymously Yours, a Club Service initiative that allowed students to exchange



anonymous, colour-coded cards containing thoughtful messages for their peers, fostering a spirit of camaraderie and connection within the college community. Members also had the opportunity to attend the book launch of Dr. Shashi Tharoor's "Our Living Constitution", organised by I.I.M.U.N., where a meaningful discussion took place between Dr. Tharoor and former Chief Justice of India Justice D.Y. Chandrachud on constitutional values and democratic governance.

Community service remained a cornerstone of the Club's activities. Through the initiative Raksha Bandhan with Real Heroes, members visited Shaitaan Chowki Police Station in Dadar, a nursing home, and the Shree Siddhivinayak Temple, tying over 110 Rakhis to police personnel, nurses, and Special Forces members in appreciation of their service. On the occasion of Independence Day, the Club collaborated with Eco Army to organise a Beach Clean-Up Drive at

Prabhadevi Beach, where volunteers worked collectively to remove non-biodegradable waste and promote environmental awareness.

The Sports Avenue organised engaging activities to encourage participation and teamwork among students. Events such as Throwball: Girls Battle and Dumpster Battle, a beach volleyball tournament for male students, were conducted at Prabhadevi Beach. Additionally, the Club hosted GAME OVER, its first-ever E-Sports Tournament, introducing competitive digital gaming as a new avenue of sporting engagement within the college. It also organised All Badminton 2.0 championship, a two-day badminton championship conducted across multiple categories for both club members and college students.

The Club also celebrated cultural and festive occasions through innovative initiatives. During Ganesh Chaturthi, the Majha Bappa, a digital campaign that invited students to share their celebrations through the Club's social media platforms. Navratri was observed through SHAKTI, a nine-day digital campaign featuring personal reflections of female members on womanhood, and Dholida, a Garba celebration that brought students together for an afternoon of traditional dance and festivity.



One of the most notable achievements of the year was the Club's role as the Support Host Club for Jashn-e-3141, a fellowship event organised by Rotaract District 3141, where RCBACL welcomed international delegates from France and Germany along with participants from Gujarat. The Club's contribution was formally acknowledged by the district, highlighting its growing recognition within the Rotaract community.



Further extending its community engagement, members collaborated with Connect Us NGO for a Wall Painting initiative, where volunteers beautified a school environment by painting vibrant murals aimed at creating a more inspiring learning space for students.

The year concluded with the Club's 13th Installation Ceremony, where the new leadership and General Body Members for Rotaract Year 2025–2026 were formally installed under the theme "Vini, Vidi, Vici" – I came, I saw, I conquered.
